

Service integration across the continuum of care




Overview of NACRS Clinic Lite


- Low cost/low burden submission option in NACRS that minimizes manual data capture and retrospective coding.
- Suitable and customizable for many clinic types across the continuum of care.
- Allows for rapid onboarding by focusing on data available electronically/already being collected at the point of care.
- Provides valuable information for health care organizations, health authorities and ministries.



Making data submissions easier

Pick list development process

Identify the specific area and clinical panel

Establish requirements

Collaborate to develop clinician friendly terms in scope for the project Map terms and synonyms to ICD-10-CA/CCI following a documented procedure

Determine Main and Other Problem terms

Review & QA

Release -Maintenance -Updates



Making data submissions easier continued

Mapping

Identify the classification to use and the version

Specify Limitations

Provide inclusion/exclusion considerations

Explain best fit versus specific codes

Format to preferred client display



Value of data

- NACRS Clinic Lite open-year data will be available for analysis and reporting. Data from clinics can also be included in broader analysis.
- Can support an ambulatory care planning and management framework and/or to provide indicators for health system performance.
- Measures key elements and variables of ambulatory care; can be used to improve quality of service as well as for potential efficiency and effectiveness gains.
- Provides patient level data for planning and evaluation of ambulatory care services equity, access, adherence to policies, sustainability, etc.



Value of data continued

Who the patient is:

- Health Care Number (HCN)
- Gender
- Birth date

Where the patient came from:

- Postal code
- Province/territory issuing HCN

When the patient visited the clinic:

- Fiscal year
- Submission period
- Registration date

What brought the patient to the clinic:

• Problem picklist based on ICD-10-CA codes

What services were provided to the patient:

- Reporting facility
- Mode of visit









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
