• Despite investments in jurisdictional immunization registries, information is incomplete. Immunization information exists in silos and not all getting into the registry.













The Immunization Registry Landscape and Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) Role

Align and Agree on the Key Data

- Create a collaboration mechanism
- Identify key stakeholders who need to come together
- An implementer must drive the progress of the work
- Narrow down use cases and identify the data dictionary



Standards for a National Network of Immunization Registries


Goal

Nationally agreed upon functional standards and essential data elements will provide the necessary building blocks for achieving the goal of a national network of immunization registries

Vision

- **Truly national standards** for a network of immunization registries endorsed and adopted by Federal, Provincial and Territorial decision makers
- National standards will be **useful** by supporting:
 - Interoperability goals
 - Access to immunization status
 - Immunization coverage reporting
 - Adverse Event Following Immunization (AEFI) reporting
 - Vaccine Supply Management
 - Information sharing across the immunization landscape in Canada to ensure effective, safe and equitable program delivery

Governance: Vision for the Canadian Vaccine Catalogue Infrastructure





Achievements

- Pragmatic and timely collaboration with national and jurisdictional partners
 - Including collaboration amongst advisory committees
- Developed a set of Immunization data elements and subsets for sharing data (built on earlier vaccine subset work)
- Infoway investments
- PHAC investments



Jurisdictional representatives are championing efforts



Lessons Learned

- The right people with trusted relationships need to lead stakeholder momentum and alignment
- Aligning national and project initiatives WITHOUT involvement with the national agencies will only get you limited adoption
- Find the common interest amongst all stakeholders to motivate engagement
- Just do it!
